GAME NOTES

KEY TAKEAWAYS

TONIGHT'S GAME – The Colorado Eagles take on the Tucson Roadrunners tonight in the first game of a two-game series.

THE SERIES – Colorado will face Tucson 12 times this season, with six of those games taking place at the Budweiser Events Center. The Eagles are tied in the season series with a record of 5-3-0 through the first eight meetings.

THE ALL-TIME SERIES – The Eagles are 14-6-0 all-time against the Roadrunners, including a 6-2-0 mark in games played at the BEC.

EAGLES' LAST GAME (2/8) – The Colorado Eagles scored three power play goals, including a pair from forward Sheldon Dries, as the Eagles erased a 2-0 deficit to defeat the San Jose Barracuda 4-3 in overtime on Saturday. Forward T.J. Tynan collected three assists in the winning effort, while defensemen Conor Timmins and Jacob MacDonald each notched two assists. The win was Colorado's fourth consecutive victory and now ties the Eagles with Stockton for second place in the AHL's Pacific Division.

ROADRUNNERS' LAST GAME (2/8) – The Roadrunners jumped out to a 4-0 lead and cruised to a 5-1 victory over the Ontario Reign on Saturday. Forwards Brayden Burke and Hudson Fasching each posted three-point performances, while goaltender Tyler Parks earned the win in net, making 21 saves on 22 shots.

LAST MEETING (2/1) – Eagles defenseman Jacob MacDonald scored the game-tying goal late in the third period to force overtime, while forward Jayson Megna netted the game-winner in a shootout, as Colorado defeated the Tucson Roadrunners 3-2. Goaltender Hunter Miska stopped 30 of the 32 shots he faced through 65 minutes of action and shutdown all five shooters in the shootout to collect the win in net.

BY THE NUMBERS

STREAKING- Colorado's current four-game winning streak is the longest such streak for the Eagles since the team rattled off eight consecutive victories between December 14th and January 3rd. Over the past four games the Eagles have outscored their opponents 16-9, winning one game in a shootout while collecting another victory in overtime.

VERY SPECIAL- Colorado's power play connected for three goals, including the game-winner, in the Eagles 4-3 win over San Jose on Saturday. The man-advantage has found the back of the net in four of the last five contests. During that five-game stretch the Eagles have gone 4-18 on the power play, which is good for a 22.2% success rate. In addition, Colorado has also flexed its muscle on the penalty kill, netting three shorthanded goals in the last six games.
